

## IT'S YOUR CASE

Species: Cat

Breed: Unknown

Sex: Unknown

Age: Young

**Clinical History:** Young cat who has been missing for 2 days, now severely lame.

**Details of study and technical comments:** Orthogonal views of RH stifle region are available.

**Diagnostic interpretation:**

**RIGHT HIND:** In the distal femoral physis, there is a SH2 fracture - meaning there is a fracture line that extends through the physis and the metaphysis (metaphyseal involvement is minor). There is severe caudomedial displacement of the fracture with overriding and the proximal femoral fragment reaches the skin surface with gas in the soft tissues (open fracture). The soft tissue is thick.

The included hip, pelvis, caudal abdomen, and tibia are normal.

**Conclusions:**

1. Acute, open, SH2 fracture of R distal femur
  - a. Minimal comminution
  - b. Severe displacement and overriding
